

We particularly remember the bonfire nights, when we would serve hot soup from the garage, and the display would be held on the field next door... until one year we managed to set light to the next field along !

Ted enjoyed many different interests. From the early days of DIY and tending his allotment, to his more recent interests, particularly singing with the local choir. He was also well known for his walking. Rarely a day went by when he didn't set out to roam the local countryside, delighting in the natural world, and even more so when in the company

of friends. And of course he would never turn down the opportunity to stop off at the Country Kitchen for a coffee along the way, or even a whole breakfast !

He also had a lifelong love of football. He played semi-professionally in his youth, and was involved at various levels with local clubs later in his life, particularly AFC Sudbury. He was also a keen cyclist, and completed a two week ride from Land's End to John O'Groats in his fifties, with his brother's family, despite subsequently finding out that he had a faulty heart valve...

Some of the happiest moments in his, and our lives have been the many births, marriages and anniversaries that we've been fortunate to celebrate in the village. Those occasions were all the more special because of the friends that we shared them with. Of course, there have also been many farewells over the years, and we can only wonder at the reunions that are now taking place without us.

They say it takes a village to raise a child, but of course that is only part of the story. Assington welcomed us as a family when we first arrived, and the village has supported Ted ever since, especially when he lost Marion.

Now that he has passed on too, we would like to say a heartfelt 'Thank You' on his behalf, to everybody that he called a friend.

Ted loved living in Assington.

Our family first moved here almost fifty years ago, and although they probably didn't know it then, Ted & Marion had already found their 'forever' home.

They made many friends along the way, and were very active in the village, getting involved with the village hall, both old and new; the local pub; countless parties and concerts; harvest festivals: horticultural shows; dances; aerobics classes; the annual fete, particularly the golf and the raffle; jubilees and coronations... the list goes on.

He was a leading voice in the Choir, had many, many friends there, and will be terribly missed by all of us. Nettie





NATURE WATCH



A WEEKEND AWAY, WELL WORTH THE VISIT!

This is somewhat of a combined nature report-cum-traveloge: On the weekend of 15th June, some friends visited, and combined this with a trip to the Broads, with the objective of seeing (and photographing) Swallowtail butterflies in the English countryside, having seen many abroad in warmer climes, but wishing to complete their portfolio.

It is difficult to recall that we have actually had any beautifully sunny days this year, but the photos tell a different story!

They were extremely fortunate to be blessed with blue skysunny days on their excursion.

Their first stop was to Ickworth (National Trust) property, just in time for a guided house tour before it opened up to the public, and it was really interesting and informative.

Then they visited a couple of nature reserves before arriving at their hotel near Lowestoft. On arrival they were delighted to find they had been upgraded



to the rather opulent Oak Suite - 2 storey with lounge and patio downstairs and bedroom upstairs with views on 3 sides and spa bath. The hotel was lovely, set in extensive gorgeous grounds backing on to Oulton Broad and dining room in an 18c barn.



Monday was a glorious day: they went to Hickling Broad, saw 4 Swallowtail butterflies in the morning so were very happy.

They then went to Wroxham and went on a 2 hour boat trip on the Broads, which was very relaxing.





On the Tuesday they went down to Sizewell Power Station (!!) as they had been told there were special, rare bee orchids to be found behind the beach there, with white petals instead of the usual pink. And indeed there were and they were very striking.



Also white marsh orchids.



Their final stop was Hyde Hall RHS gardens, which were very attractive and broke up the journey home nicely.
